5th ANNUAL ELTU CREATIVE WRITING COMPETITION 2023-2024

TERMS AND GUIDELINES

- 1. Entrants must be current students at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Undergraduate and postgraduate students from all faculties and programs are encouraged to enter their work.
- 2. All entries must directly or indirectly respond to the current theme, "Near and Far."
- Entries shall be submitted at the following Formstack link:

- 4. All entries must be received by 11:59 PM on May 19th, 2024.
- 5. An entrant may only submit **one piece per prose category** (short story and creative nonfiction) and a **maximum of two poems in the poetry category**.
- Word count: Prose submissions are limited to a maximum of 1500 words (excluding title) and poetry submissions are limited to a maximum of two poems, each with a maximum page count of three pages.
- 7. An entrant may choose to submit to more than one category.
- 8. Entries may not be altered after submission.
- 9. Every piece must have a title.
- 10. Entries must be written in English.
- 11. Entries must be original work. Any form of plagiarism, including AI generated work will disqualify the entry.

- 12. Entries should not have been previously published, whether online or in print (including selfpublishing on a blog). However, after publication in the anthology, entrants can attempt to publish their pieces in other publications and platforms, as long as the piece is accompanied with an acknowledgement of initial publication in the anthology.
- Entries from the previous rounds of the ELTU's creative writing competition will not be accepted.
- 14. There is no submission or reading fee to enter the competition.
- 15. All entries will be reviewed by a professional judging panel who will determine the winners. The judges' decisions are final.
- 16. The competition organizers reserve the right to change the judging panel without notice.
- 17. All entries are judged anonymously. The entrant's identification information, including name and student number, will not be included on the piece(s) for the final review. The judging panel will not have access to the accompanying submission forms. For confidentiality purposes, please remove all identification information from all entries.
- 18. First place winners will each receive \$1000 in book vouchers and finalists will each receive \$250 in book vouchers.
- 19. First place winners, finalists, and honourable mention recipients will be published in the competition anthology. Selected entries will be subject to being edited upon publication in the anthology.
- 20. Entrants will be notified of the results after the judging period has concluded. This will likely be in the fall of 2024.
- 21. The ELTU reserves the right to use the competition submissions for English Across the Curriculum (EAC) project purposes.
- 22. All personal data and information collected will be used for EAC administration purposes only and will not be disclosed to any third parties.
